David Griffin: Chair

David retired from the Police in 2015, after serving 30 years. He has planted a vineyard and set up a winery with a local farmer friend. In a first for our Parish Council, he championed a Parish Poll in 2022 on the proposed Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty status for the Yorkshire Wolds. A large majority of residents opposed the inclusion of Thixendale and this will be the Council's position on the matter when formal consultation commences. David has been a co-opted governor at nearby Leavening Primary School since 2019, where he is the mathematics link governor.
